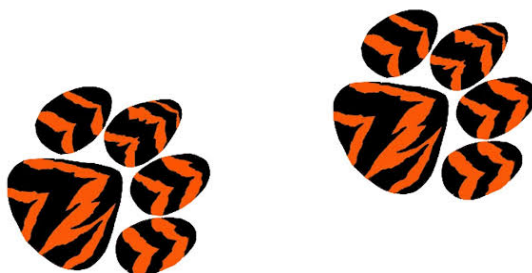

PICK UP AND DROP OFF PROCEDURES

Morning Drop Off Procedure Reminder:
