The information in this packet is presented as a resource for students and their parents interested in elementary summer school courses. SD 308 offers various enrichment courses for elementary aged students. You are encouraged to review these materials carefully before registering. Students may choose to enroll in one, two, or three class offerings. All summer school courses will be held at Churchill Elementary School.

### **Course Fees:**

- One Hour Course: \$80.00
- Two Hour Course: \$160.00
- Three Hour Course: \$240.00

Tuition must be paid in full to hold a student's slot in summer school. Students will not be allowed to attend class until tuition is paid in full. Tuition is waived for all students who qualify for waived fees. (If you are unsure of your fee status, please contact your home school.)

### **Payment:**

### **Dropping A Course and Refunds:**

Students may choose to drop a course prior to the first day and receive a full refund. After classes begin, a student may drop but will not receive a refund.

### **Transportation:**

Bus transportation will be available for students. The bus schedule and stops will be based on enrollment and communicated to families the first week of June by the Transportation Department. Stops will be at or near several 308 schools; additional stops will be considered based on enrollment. Bus transportation will be provided to school for 8:30 a.m. classes and will be available for the 11:30 a.m. dismissal only.

<p><b>Reader's Theater Camp and Genre Journey</b></p> <p>This course is designed for students to develop their reading fluency, vocabulary, and writing skills as they participate in Readers' Theater. The imaginative, leveled scripts support the different reading abilities of students while fostering a fun and creative learning environment. Students will not only enjoy the reading material, but will also get to create props and scenery for their plays. In the second aspect of this course the students will be able to build the fluency and automaticity of text, while being supported by material that addresses their current reading abilities. This course will use the district's adopted comprehension strategies and skills. We will target key vocabulary as well as writing skills and concepts while delving in the different genres. Genres will include: fairy tales, poetry, mysteries, biographies, and fiction and non-fiction texts.</p>	<p><b>\$240.00</b></p>	<p><b>6/6—6/24 8:30—11:30</b></p>

<p><b>First and Second Grade Art Enrichment</b></p> <p><b>Eligibility: Students that completed First and Second Grade in the 2015-2016 school year</b></p> <p>This course is designed for students who will create various artworks and explore a variety of mediums in art. Students will learn and practice new art skills/techniques, review art vocabulary, and discuss Art History aligned with the School District 308 Elementary Art Curriculum. Students will also participate in discussions/art critique about their artworks. Some topics to explore may include: drawing, watercolors, tempera painting, collage, printmaking, sculpture, abstract art, realistic art, landscapes, portraits, still life, cartooning, and weaving.</p>	<p><b>\$80.00</b></p>	<p><b>6/6—6/24 10:30—11:30</b></p>
<p><b>Disney Art</b></p> <p><b>Eligibility: Students that completed Third, Fourth, and Fifth Grade in the 2015-2016 school year</b></p> <p>This course is designed for students who will create their favorite Disney characters using various art techniques and learning from famous artists from the past. We will use Van Gogh's Starry Night to create Cinderella's Castle and Andy Warhol's soup cans to make Mickey Mouse. <p><b>Convergent and Divergent Thinking</b></p> <p><b>Eligibility: Students that completed Kindergarten, First, and Second Grade in the 2015-2016 school year</b></p> <p>This course is designed for students who will experience the challenge of convergent and divergent thinking skills through a variety of activities. Thinking strategies will be developed through stories, challenging activities, logic puzzles, and games.</p>	<p><b>\$80.00</b></p>	<p><b>6/6—6/24 8:30—9:30</b></p>
<p><b>Master Multiplication and Division</b></p> <p><b>Eligibility: Students that completed Third, Fourth, and Fifth Grade in the 2015-2016 school year</b></p> <p>This course is designed for students who will strengthen the basic multiplication and division facts through games, fun facts, and projects.
